

# Arrangements in place to safeguard and promote the welfare of students

All staff are given regular safeguarding training including the non-teaching staff.

Every campus is a fully secured enclosed area with the entrance secured by security guards.

There is a termly meeting between the Designated Safeguarding Lead and the Safeguarding governor concerning any safeguarding concerns and procedures.

We ensure that there are topics in PSHCE lessons as well as assemblies which help students to be more independent and take on some responsibility for looking after their own welfare and how to remain safe and what to do if they are worried about their own welfare or safety.

The Campus Manager carries out regular inspections of the different campuses, together with the Health and Safety governor, in order to ensure the safety of the different campuses. Similarly, equipment is regularly checked for safety. There is a register for near misses and accidents which is monitored by the Campus Manager in order to prevent future recurrences/issues.

Shade is provided on each campus for students in the Summer.

We have a policy of healthy eating.

We have drinking water dispensers throughout the school.

We have single sex pupil toilets throughout the school with washing facilities.

We have two doctors to cover medical issues and there are staff on each campus who are First Aid trained.

Class teachers in Primary and Form Tutors in Senior are responsible for the pastoral care of pupils.

We have a school counsellor.
